Surprised by GOD'S GLOBY

JOHN 1:16

"So the Word became human and made his home among us. He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness . . . From his abundance we have all received one gracious blessing after another." (John 1:14-16, NLT)

The highlight of my childhood summers was Family Picnic day. My father belonged to a social club that had a lakeside park, and on a designated day hundreds of club members and their families would pack the park for a summer celebration. There were games and contests, a clown with a crooked nose and an invisible dog, boat rides, and fire trucks on display. And—best of all—there was Mr. Frosty, a soft-serve ice cream truck that handed out cones—vanilla, chocolate, and twists—unlimited, and at no cost for the whole day! Growing up in a rural area where the sight and sound of an ice cream truck was unknown, and where the nearest Dairy Queen was twenty miles distant, I marveled at the abundance of Mr. Frosty at Family Picnic!

As I read the first chapter of John's gospel, that child-like sense of awe and wonder wells up once again to a far greater degree as I contemplate the abundance of God's grace revealed to us through the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. With John, I marvel that the Word that was in the beginning, that was with God, that actually was God, became the light that pierced the darkness of the world, took on human flesh, and made his home among us. And I realize this is not only of cosmic and corporate significance, it is also deeply relational and personal as God's abundance overflows to each of us in "one gracious blessing after another" or, as older and more literal translations express it, as "grace upon grace"—one undeserved, unearned, unqualified, unconditional expression of God's favor after another.

Throughout the sweep of God's self-revelation in Scripture, though, the outpouring of God's gracious abundance is not only to us and for us—it is to us and for us so that it may be through us. God called Abraham not only that he and his family would experience God's

blessing, but so that all nations would be blessed through him (Genesis 12:1-3). According to John, it was not to only the chosen few, but to all who believed him and accepted him that he gave the right to be called children of God (John 1:12). In the book of Acts we see this good news of God's grace penetrating barriers of religion, language, and culture in everbroadening circles beginning in Jerusalem and reaching to "the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

The tragic error of God's people through the ages, and right up to our own day, has been to treat God's gracious goodness as if it were scarce rather than abundant, to receive it with a sense of privilege rather than responsibility, to guard it, cling to it, restrict it, and keep it to ourselves. God's abundance will not, though, be contained. God continues to pour grace into his people so that through us he might touch the lives of individuals and communities who have yet to hear of the name of Jesus, to experience his healing touch, or to be transformed by the Word and the Spirit.

As the Apostle Paul encouraged the believers in Corinth to give generously to a collection for fellow believers in need, he expressed confidence that their capacity to give was rooted in the ongoing outpouring of God's abundant grace. "God is able to make all grace overflow to you," he told them, "so that . . . you may have an abundance for every good deed" (2 Corinthians 9:8, NASB). Let us not be a people who merely find satisfaction in being recipients of God's abundant grace. Let us be churches, families, and individuals who allow that grace to overflow through us for the blessing of others! As you give to this year's World Mission Offering, may you do so in recognition and celebration of God's amazing and abundant grace.
